# 1. UX Design and Decisions

Our User Experience (UX) philosophy is:

- **Simple**, easy to use... over complex features
- Our solution must be **beautiful**... this only happens with a dedication to UX aesthetics and consistency
- We are building a **solution**... not a tool; we're building an axe, not a Swiss army knife. We will favor fixed features with few options... over programmatic

Dinner Out is a web application, not an app. The software runs inside a browser. We'll look great on an iPad, laptop or PC. We'll look OK on a smartphone.

Optimize our "tight loop": 1) Teacher login, 2) choose a student, 3) do a behavioral session. This is our primary purpose. It's what users will spend most of their time doing.

Be graphical where possible. Icons over text. Student icons. Behavior squares.

Our color scheme is from Autism Awareness Ribbon: blue, light blue, red, and yellow.



## 2. Capstone 2017

The Capstone 2017 project has one goal: **Make our users happy.**

*Rationale - Our users are the teachers of students with autism at Turning Pointe. If these experts like our software, there's a good chance that others will as well.*

### Capstone Agreement

The “tight loop” - Login, Select student, Begin session, Done. Most users will be doing this most of the time. Small number of screens. Easy to use. Right in the Home page.

Admin: centralized school setup and control:

- Teachers, Students, Squares
- Create, remove, view, edit
- Assign students to teachers

Decentralized approach (for smaller places): make everyone an Admin.

Teacher powers: Admin, Analysis, Session-only

Analysis: reports, charts, CSV export to Excel

Super User security: there if system is breached.

Super secret - hope to get our “tight loop” working on a smartphone
