What's an op-ed piece?

- The NY Times says: "Articles typically run from 400 to 1,200 words" ([link](#)).
- The Wall Street Journal says: "Op-Eds: 600-1200 words, double-spaced. The piece must center on a strong argument about an issue in the news and not be a response to a Journal article. Please use jargon-free language." ([link](#))

I'll probably ask for a printout and electronic version. Stay tuned.

2. Read Ruby on Rails Tutorial - For our project, we'll be using the Ruby programming language and its associated web application framework, Rails. In class, we'll work on the tutorial in Ruby on Rails Tutorial by Michael Hartl. You can buy the book for \$30 (**like I did**, it's really nice to highlight), or it's free online at www.railstutorial.org/.
